Meeting called to order at 6:30 by Diane Kane, President. Members Present: 48; No guests.

<u>Secretary's Report</u> -- October meeting minutes. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Helen Short, second by Sharon Perry. Motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> from October 2017 meeting. Motion to accept report made by Mary Jane Marchelewicz, second by Nanc Ekiert. Discussion: Correction to the Secretary's Report was made to change the deposit amount from \$230.00 to \$240. Motion to accept report as amended was approved.

Committee Reports

Programs

- December Meeting: Our December 13 meeting is the planned Holiday Potluck with collection of donations for a local food shelf. Helen Short will bring a list of area food shelves for member to determine where donations will go this year. Kris Kilburn asked members to prepare for discussions at the December meeting on their topics of interest, i.e. landscape, bags, etc., for the March meeting trunk show and workshop by presenter Sarah Ann Smith. - January Meeting: Jean Anne Branch reminded members that Anne Standish will be the presenter at the January 19th meeting. Anne lives in Jericho and is known for her amazing landscape and art quilts. On Saturday, January 20, Anne will lead a workshop on preparing a small quilt from a photograph. The workshop will be limited to fifteen quilters and the cost is \$35. Each quilter can use a photo supplied by Anne or a personal photo of a landscape, flower, etc. A copy of the photo should be supplied to Anne before January 5 at annestandishvt@gmail.com

Membership News

- Updated membership list is available. Please review and provide Helen Short corrections.
- Helen Short will purchase lanyards to replace our current name tags, many are in damaged condition. Teri Brunelle has offered to print the name labels.

<u>Fundraising</u>: Bonnie Evans shared that fundraising has resulted in \$1,600 in sponsor donations for the campaign to help pay quilt show expenses. Bonnie will solicit additional local business in the coming days. The fundraising will end December 31, 2017 and all who have donated will be recognized at the time of the quilt show. Reminder, donation levels are at Gold -- \$200, Silver -- \$100, and \$50 -- Bronze.

<u>2017 Raffle Quilt</u>: Penny LaRochelle has 500 books of ticket available for the raffle quilt drawing. Penny shared that there will be a prize (or two) for those who sell the most tickets. The raffle quilt in teals and blues,

sewed by Denise Chase and quilted by Babette Coons, was displayed at the meeting.

2018 Raffle Quilt: Carol Stanley shared the 2018 raffle quilt design, Narraganset Blues, a Bonnie Hunter designed pattern. For the next meeting, Carol asked members bring in 4 patches of 2 ½ squares (finished at 3 ½" square) in colors other than blue. In addition, she asked members bring in medium to dark blues in 3½" x 6½" rectangles (or 3½" by WOF). Sharon Perry has volunteered to complete the quilting.

Quilt Show

- Six quilt show entries have been turned in. Reminder, each quilt entry received by Kay Benedict before December 13 will provide the member an additional chance to win the basket of prizes. The drawing for the basket will be held at the December 13 meeting. As soon as you can, please provide Kay your quilt entries, giving her the time to design the display.
- Motion to allow a member to have quilt show publicity printed in the amount up to \$125. Motion made by Bonnie Evans, second by Sharon Perry; motion passed.
- Kris Kilburn asked members to consider bringing fat quarters to the December meeting for addition to the Quilt Show Fat Quarter Basket.

Projects

- Helen Short presented the next Block of the Month, "On the Oregon Trail" available at Quilter's Cache, http://www.quilterscache.com/O/OntheOregonTrailBlock.html. Helen recommends 2½ yards of background fabric and 5-6 fat quarters to complete the entire quilt. October block was "Red Cross Block" and September was Mini Bow Tie blocks, patterns also available at www.quilterscache.com. Members displayed their completed Red Cross Blocks at the meeting.
- Bonnie Evans offered members the opportunity to purchase raffle tickets for 3 prizes, a beautiful quilt she made or 2 gas cards, to benefit the Northwestern Medical Center Auxiliary. Members present who purchased tickets were also entered into a drawing for a prize at the end of the meeting.

<u>Charity Quilts</u>: Charity quilts kits were brought to the meeting by Alice Bushey for Franklin County Home Health, Denise Chase for Laurie's House, and Adrienne Perrino for duffle bags for Bags of Love.

Other Business

- Diane Kane updated members about a request for quilts from organizers of Camp Ta-Kum-Ta, a summer camp for children 7 to 17 years old who have or have had cancer. Cindy Metayer indicated she would contact the organization to find how many quilts they may need.
- Follow-up: The camp hosts roughly 70 campers each summer. Each camper receives a new quilt on their bed which they also bring home. If possible, the

organization would appreciate 5 to 20 from the guild. It is recommended each quilt be twin size or smaller. Camp Ta-Kum-Ta would like a commitment of the number of quilts to be donated by the first of May and delivery to the organization by July.

• Sad news was reported that Ann Jacobs, former fouryear FCQG president, had passed away. Motion was made by Margaret Miller, second by Christy Mulyca, to recognize Ann by contributing to the charity of her or her family's choice in the amount of \$100. Motion passed. If her family is willing, the guild would also like to honor Ann by displaying one of her quilts at the upcoming FCQG quilt show.

86 DAYS AND COUNTING

The 2018 Quilt Show, the guild's 20th show, is less than 3 months away, and planning continues behind the scenes. Continue reading to see how you can help.

- We need quilts!!! It's all about the quilts!!! As of the November guild meeting, we had 27 quilts registered, and we need more to fill City Hall. Although the deadline to register your quilt is March 1st, please turn in your entry forms and photos as soon as possible so Kay Benedict has plenty of time to enter your information, plan a pleasing

layout for everyone's quilts, and print all the cards and other information needed. You can find the registration form at this link, http://www.franklincountyquilters.org/fcqgregistration.pdf, or on our facebook page.

- We need strong, young women or men!!! We need people to help with the pick-up and unloading (on Friday) and loading and return (on Sunday) of the quilt poles. We'll take husbands, daughters/sons, grand-daughters/grand-sons or sisters/brothers to help move the poles. This is a great way for high schoolers to earn some community service hours!
- We need volunteers! Bonnie Evans will have the volunteer sign-up sheet at the January meeting. As an added incentive, Anyone who signs up gets their name in a nice drawing for each job, i.e. 2 jobs/slots, 2 chances. The success of the guild's quilt show truly depends on the help of many volunteers. There are plenty of jobs available, so please be sure to sign up for a job (or jobs) which fit your schedule and physical abilities.
- We need donations!!! The Teacup Auction needs items for the Auction table. Table runners/toppers, matching placemats and napkins, bags and totes, wall-hangings, gift baskets, and quilt kits have all been popular sellers in the past. If you have an item to donate, bring it to a meeting and give it to Sally Krupp. We also need **fat quarters** for the basket of FQs and **non-perishable brunch food** for the food basket as the 2nd and 3rd prizes for the raffle. And we need donations for the **door prize**...tea, lotions, coffee, maple syrup, etc. And if you'd like to help out, we need someone to collect and organize the door prize and make it look pretty to display on the admissions table...might that someone be you???
- We need your raffle tickets!!! Penny LaRochelle still has tickets available for those members who have not yet picked up their tickets. She also asks that each member return the raffle tickets and money for the tickets in an envelope with the member's name written on the outside. Penny wants to be sure to properly credit the returned tickets. As a reminder, each member is required to sell (or buy) two books of raffle tickets to remain a member in good standing.
- Don't forget to complete and enter your Challenge Quilts!!! Kay Benedict has issued a challenge to all guild members to complete a Black & White quilt plus one other color. The additional color is your choice. The quilt can be any design and use any techniques. The only restriction is the quilt cannot exceed 120" in its perimeter measurement. There's still plenty of time to make something for the challenge.
- Don't forget to schedule an appointment for a quilt appraisal!!! Sandra Palmer will be doing appraisals during the quilt show again this year. The appraisals Sandra completes are useful if a quilt is ever damaged or lost. Without an appraisal, insurance companies will only pay to replace the materials used to make the quilt. If a quilt is appraised, the insurance company must work with the appraised value for an insurance settlement.
















JANUARY 2018 BLOCK OF THE MONTH PATTERN: SNOWBALL NINE PATCH

FOOD DRIVE MOVED TO JANUARY

Since the December meeting was cancelled, we're moving the guild's food drive to the January meeting. Members are asked to bring non-perishable food donations for the local food shelf and/or donations for the "Bags of Love" project. You can also contribute monetary donations to the drive. Donations for this drive will be going to the Enosburg food shelf.

QUILT TIPS

- Use plain water only when washing out water soluble marker pens from your fabric, and hand wash well, as detergents and ironing may set the ink permanently.
- Use different widths of masking tape to guide you in an easy way to quilt parallel lines without marking the quilt top.
- Better to buy more fabric than you think you need for a quilt, rather than too little, as this allows room for mistakes, shrinkage or making a sample block, and for building your stash.
- Always bring the bobbin thread to the top of the quilt before beginning to sew so you can avoid any tangling on the back.
- If possible, lay your batting out flat somewhere for a couple of days to allow it to relax before you quilt it, so you don't get caught with wrinkles or creases.
- Everyone has UFOs (Unfinished Projects). Make the effort to go through them and decide what you do actually want to finish, then you can cull the rest and either give them to friends or charity, or sell them.
- Make your quilt rod / hanging sleeve from a patchwork of all the fabric used in your quilt.
 Then, if you need to repair anything on the quilt top later, you will have a selection of the right fabrics to use.

MANAGING WORKS IN PROGRESS

Working on multiple quilting projects? Try these tips to keep things in order and moving forward.

Count them one by one...

- Take a look around your creative space and make a list of all the projects that are in the works.
- A second list may be needed for projects with purchased fabrics, but haven't been started.
- Prioritize the In the Works list.

Make a schedule...

- Grab a calendar and beginning with the highest priority project, schedule the project.
- Try to be realistic with the time needed to complete the project.
- Very Important: Assign a due date. Make it a Red Letter Day on the calendar.
- Continue scheduling the remaining projects in order of priority.

Sprinkle work days with creative energizers...

- Stick to the schedule, but remember the joy!
- From time to time, take a few minutes to rejuvenate your creative spirit.
- Take breaks and be sure to do something different for the break like take a walk.
- Invite a friend over to visit with you while you work. They might even iron for you!!!
- Take your sewing machine to a new location.
- When your favorite song comes on, stop and DANCE!

Organize projects by stages...

- Break projects into stages and plan out each stage.
- Overlap projects so they are at varying stages.
- Create a guide for each project.
