Chair Reports:

We had a lot of fun and good discussions. And some were actually able to get a bit of sewing done even if it was only a couple of blocks.

The next one is the Winter Blues Zoom Sew Along on Sunday, January 24th. Sharon Perry will open a Zoom session starting at 10:00 am and will keep the session open until 4:00 pm. The Winter Blues Sew Along will focus on making comfort quilts. However, members do not have to make a comfort quilt to participate in the fun. To make things interesting, there will be a drawing at the end of the Sew Along. The prize is a copy of Bonnie Hunter's latest quilt pattern, *Winter Blues*, along with a bundle of blue scraps for variety to make your own Winter Blues quilt.

The February Pajama Party Sew Along will be on Sunday, February 21st, and yes, you're invited to wear your pajamas to the Sew Along. Following Helen Short's demonstration of Doug Leko's <u>Mysterious</u> quilt pattern at the guild meeting, we invite guild members to make their own <u>Mysterious</u> quilt during the Sew Along. As a note, members do not have to make the <u>Mysterious</u> quilt to participate in the Sew Along.

January is National Soup Month. These are some of this newsletter editor's favorite soups.

RECIPE CORNER: CREAMY HAM CORN CHOWDER

4 cups cubed peeled potatoes

2 Tbsp. chopped onion

½ cup butter

³/₄ cup flour

¼ tsp. pepper

Pinch ground nutmeg

4 cups chicken broth

4 cups half-and-half cream

2 cups (8 oz.) each shredded cheddar cheese

3 cups cubed fully cooked ham

1 pkg. (16 oz.) frozen corn, thawed

Place potatoes in a large saucepan and cover with water. Bring to boil. Reduce heat; cover and cook for 10 to 15 minutes or until tender.

Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, cook onion in butter over medium heat for 2 minutes. Stir in the flour, pepper, and nutmeg; gradually add broth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in cream and cheese; transfer to a 5-quart slow cooker.

Drain potatoes and add to slow cooker. Stir in ham, Cover and cook on low for 3 hours.

Stir in corn and cook 30 minutes longer or until heated through and vegetables are tender. Yield: 12 servings. Recipe can by halved or quartered to accommodate your slow cooker size.

RECIPE CORNER: SLOW COOKER CHICKEN CHILI

1 onion, chopped

1 16-oz can black beans, undrained

1 16-oz can kidney beans, undrained

1 8-oz can tomato sauce

10 oz package frozen corn kernels

2 (14.5-oz each) cans diced tomatoes with chilies (check the spice level- I used mild) Taco seasoning (recipe below bumfuzzle)

Salt and pepper to taste

2-3 boneless skinless chicken breasts

Combine onions, beans, tomato sauce, corn, diced tomatoes with chilies, taco seasoning, salt and pepper.

Place chicken on top and spoon a thin layer of chili on top. Cook on high for 5 hours.

About an hour before serving, remove chicken and shred in a separate bowl. Place shredded chicken into the slow cooker and stir in to combine with beans etc. Cover and place slow cooker on "low" setting for an hour to allow chicken to soak in the chili flavor.

Taco Seasoning

1 tablespoon chili powder

¼ teaspoon garlic powder

1/4 teaspoon onion powder

1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes

1/4 teaspoon dried oregano

½ teaspoon paprika

1½ teaspoons ground cumin

1 teaspoon sea salt

1 teaspoon black pepper

RECIPE CORNER: MINESTRONE WITH ITALIAN SAUSAGE

1 pound bulk Italian sausage

I large onion, chopped

2 large carrots, chopped

2 celery ribs, chopped

I medium leek (white portion only), chopped

1 medium zucchini, cut into ½-inch pieces

¹/₄ pound fresh green beans, trimmed and cut into ¹/₂-inch pieces

3 garlic cloves, minced

6 cups beef broth

2 cans (14.5-oz each) diced tomatoes with

basil, oregano and garlic

3 cups shredded cabbage

1 teaspoon dried basil

1 teaspoon dried oregano

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1/2 cup uncooked small pasta shells

1 can (15 ounces) garbanzo beans or

chickpeas, rinsed and drained

3 tablespoons minced fresh parsley

√ cup grated Parmesan cheese

In a Dutch oven, cook sausage and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Stir in the carrots, celery and leek; cook for 3 minutes. Add the zucchini, green beans and garlic; cook 1 minute longer.

Stir in the broth, tomatoes, cabbage, basil, oregano and pepper. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 45 minutes.

Return to a boil. Stir in the garbanzo beans, pasta and parsley. Cook for 6 - 9 minutes or until pasta is tender. Serve with cheese.

Yield: 11 servings (about 3 quarts).

For January, you will add a 6½-inch border that finishes at 6 inches. This may be a solid or pieced border. Your piece will now measure 39½ x 44 inches.

Here's what Helen Bicknell's and Lucie Fortin's projects look like so far.






QUILT TIPS

- Use plain water only when washing out water soluble marker pens from your fabric, and hand wash well, as detergents and ironing may set the ink permanently.
- When designing patterns for your quilt, don't forget you can use everyday items to draw around. Plates, cups and saucers and even cookie cutters all make great templates.
- Do not prewash your fabric when piecing miniature quilts, as the sizing in the fabric will help make it easier to piece.
- If having trouble threading your machine, especially while using dark threads, put a piece of white paper behind the needle.
- When you buy fat quarters, make sure the selvage portion with the color, manufacturer, and even the fabric collection name is on them.
 This will help if you need additional yardage.
- Plug your iron into a power strip along with a night light. When you leave your sewing room, you will know if you have left the iron on by looking at the night light.
- Use wooden chopsticks for a stiletto. Most Chinese restaurants offer these for free with the meal. The chopsticks can be sharpened in a pencil sharpener and if they break or dull they can be re-sharpened. Best of all they are free!
- Clean your machine! Clean your machine every time you use up the thread in a bobbin. Every other time take out that bobbin case when you clean and give the mechanism a drop of oil. Don't forget to change the needle often too! You and your machine will be happier.

For each month's show & tell Sharon will create a slideshow with all the photos sent to her for that month. She will "share" the slideshow during the Zoom meeting. Members will be asked to briefly describe their projects as those projects appear on the screen.

ZOOM PLATFORM BRINGS CHANGES TO GUILD MONTHLY MEETINGS

- Guild meetings will be conducted on Zoom in a virtual format; in-person meetings are cancelled for the 2020-2021 membership year. The executive board will re-evaluate when to restart in-person meetings next year.
- Guest speakers will present virtual lectures and workshops also using Zoom.
- Guild members will need to send pictures to participate in the monthly show & tell.
- Guild members will join the guild meeting by clicking a link or launching the Zoom app on their computer/device/smartphone. Sharon Perry will send all the particulars for joining one week before the meeting. The invite for the January 20th meeting will be sent out on Wednesday, January 13th.

ZOOM BEST PRACTICES

- Make sure your camera is connected and available to the Zoom app.
- Check your microphone and speaker settings before joining the Zoom session.
- Close all apps except for Zoom on your smartphone/device/computer.
- Plug your computer/device/smartphone into a power source.
- If using wi-fi, make sure your wi-fi is not overloaded (think multiple phones, devices, cameras, etc.).
- If you have a limited/unreliable internet connection, try directly plugging into your internet router.
- If you are hard of hearing or in a crowded/public space, use a headset for better sound.
- Mute your microphone when not actively speaking.
- Be aware of your surroundings and behavior (We can see you!).
- Add questions/comments in "Chat" section to be addressed by Zoom moderator.
- "Raise hand" if you would like to address the group.
- Make comments short and succinct; mute for responses.

IDEAS FOR GUILD MEMBERS WITH UNRELIABLE INTERNET CONNECTIONS

Here are some ways to join the Zoom meetings if you have a limited connection:

- Plug directly into your internet router.
- Disconnect all other devices using wi-fi during the Zoom meeting. You'd be surprised how many devices are connected to your wi-fi (think printers, smartphones, cameras, appliances, lights, etc.).
- Try using the internet connection at your local library from your car.
- Join a fellow guild member at their home as long as everyone is observing COVID-19 guidelines and have not been exposed to COVID-19.
