#### **Committee Reports**

<u>Upcoming Programs</u>: Members were reminded of the upcoming March workshops by Sarah Ann Smith. Sign up was available for the planned workshops, Birches on Saturday, March 24 and Flowers on Sunday, March 25. The fee for each workshop is \$40 each plus materials. <u>Membership News</u>: New lanyards and name cards were provided to members. Thanks go to Helen Short and Teri Brunelle for this improvement.

<u>Fundraising</u>: Deb Dusablon reported \$1,750 was raised from sponsors with \$1,000 in corporate donations. Thanks to these generous donations, expenses for the upcoming quilt show will be covered.

#### 2018 Raffle Quilt

- Denise Chase advised the 2018 raffle quilt will on display at the Art Festival to be held in St. Albans City Hall on Sunday, January 21. Raffle tickets for this quilt will be sold at that time.
- Additional raffle quilt tickets are available from Penny LaRochelle. Kris Kilburn announced there will be prizes of gift certificates for two who sell the highest number of raffle tickets by the close of the Quilt Show.

#### Quilt Show

- Bonnie Evans indicated sign-up sheets for volunteers at the Quilt Show were available to members at this time. There are lots of openings.
- Reminder, Kris Kilburn and Penny LaRochelle are looking for additional fat quarters and nonperishable breakfast items for gift baskets for the raffle.
- Kay Benedict reported 36 quilts have been entered for this year's quilt show. The deadline for entries is midnight, March 1. Providing entries as soon as you can will help Kay plan the event.
- We need someone who is willing to organize and develop a schedule for the demonstrations. A number of volunteers have already stepped forward to provide demonstrations.
- Sharon Perry reported former FCQG President, Ann Jacobs, will be honored at this year's Quilt Show with a memorial display of five or six of her quilts.

<u>2018 Charity Quilt</u>: Jean Anne Branch and Carol Stanley indicated the top for the charity quilt, Narragansett Blues, will be completed next week.

<u>Project</u>: Helen Short presented the next Block of the Month "Envelope Motif" with the pattern available at Quilter's Cache. Members displayed their finished blocks from December "On the Oregon Trail" and January "Snowball Nine Patch."

#### **Charity Quilts**

- Charity quilt kits for Laurie's House were brought to the meeting by Denise Chase.
- Due to recent fires and disasters, Helen Short has distributed 2 full-size quilts and 1 child quilt. The guild currently has fifteen twin-size quilts ready for distribution. The guild could use donations of additional full-size quilts.

#### Other Business

- Each member received a gift bag from donated articles from former FCQG member, Nancy Orcutt. Nancy was a founding member of the guild who also supplied bins of fabric for charity quilts. - Elaine Magnan shared she received a number of partially completed projects and boxes of fabric from former guild president, Ann Jacobs' collection. Elaine will bring the material and projects to the NMC conference room on Sundays from 10 to 4 for distribution to guild members willing to complete charity quilts.
- A thank you note was received for the quilt made by Deb Dusablon and provided to the 2018 First Baby Boy born at the hospital in 2018.
- Alice Rouleau has volunteered to be our librarian and John Rouleau built a bookcase to house the guild's books.
   Available books are listed on our web site. Contact Alice for book requests. Reminder, there are currently 14 books with members. If you have books to return, please contact Alice or return at a guild meeting.
- Cindy Metayer updated members that Camp Ta-Kum-Ta
  would be thrilled to have donations of five to twenty quilts
  for 2018 summer camp. Cindy received 2 quilts for the
  camp at the meeting and will solicit members next month
  for the total number of quilts that can be provided. We must
  advise the camp of the total donations by May and Cindy
  will deliver the quilts by July.



### QUILT TIPS

- Ensure your binding goes on smoothly by stitching around the edge of the quilt, to hold all three layers together, before you attach the binding.
- Quilting can be good exercise! Keep your ironing board well away from your machine and get in the habit of getting up to press every seam as you sew.
- Be careful to press seams that meet in opposite directions so as to reduce the bulkiness, and allow more accurate machine piecing. Some call this nesting the seams.
- Chocolate is a quilting tool!

#### **QUILT SHOW NEWS...51 DAYS AND COUNTING**

The 2018 Quilt Show, the guild's 20<sup>th</sup> show, is less than 2 months away, and planning continues behind the scenes. Continue reading to see how you can help.

- We need quilts!!! It's all about the quilts!!! As of the January guild meeting, we had 36 quilts registered, and we need more to fill City Hall. Although the deadline to register your quilt is March 1<sup>st</sup>, please turn in your entry forms and photos as soon as possible so Kay Benedict has plenty of time to enter your information, plan a pleasing

layout for everyone's quilts, and print all the cards and other information needed. You can find the registration form at this link, <a href="http://www.franklincountyquilters.org/fcqgregistration.pdf">http://www.franklincountyquilters.org/fcqgregistration.pdf</a>, or on our facebook page.

- We need strong, young women or men!!! We need people to help with the pick-up and unloading (on Friday) and loading and return (on Sunday) of the quilt poles. We'll take husbands, daughters/sons, grand-daughters/grand-sons or sisters/brothers to help move the poles. This is a great way for high schoolers to earn some community service hours!
- We need volunteers! Bonnie Evans will have the volunteer sign-up sheet at the February meeting. The success of the guild's quilt show truly depends on the help of many volunteers. There are plenty of jobs available, so please be sure to sign up for a job (or jobs) which fit your schedule and physical abilities.
- We need donations!!! The Teacup Auction needs items for the Auction table. Table runners/toppers, matching placemats and napkins, bags and totes, wall-hangings, gift baskets, and quilt kits have all been popular sellers in the past. If you have an item to donate, bring it to a meeting and give it to Sally Krupp. We also need fat quarters for the basket of FQs and non-perishable brunch food for the food basket as the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prizes for the raffle. Give your raffle donations to Kris Kilburn. And we need donations for the door prize...tea, lotions, coffee, maple syrup, etc. And if you'd like to help out, we need someone to collect and organize the door prize and make it look pretty to display on the admissions table...might that someone be you???
- We need your raffle tickets!!! Penny LaRochelle still has tickets available for those members who have not yet picked up their tickets. She also asks that each member return the raffle tickets and money for the tickets in an envelope with the member's name written on the outside. Penny wants to be sure to properly credit the returned tickets. As a reminder, each member is required to sell (or buy) two books of raffle tickets to remain a member in good standing.
- We need someone to coordinate show demonstrations!!! We usually have demonstrations during the show, some by the vendors and some by guild members. We need a volunteer to arrange the demos and make up a schedule. There are always lots of people willing to do a demo; we just need someone to oversee this aspect of the show. Might you be able to help the guild out?
- Don't forget to complete and enter your Challenge Quilts!!! Kay Benedict has issued a challenge to all guild members to complete a Black & White quilt plus one other color. The additional color is your choice. The quilt can be any design and use any techniques. The only restriction is the quilt cannot exceed 120" in its perimeter measurement. There's still plenty of time to make something for the challenge.
- Don't forget to schedule an appointment for a quilt appraisal!!! Sandra Palmer will be doing appraisals during the quilt show again this year. These appraisals are useful if a quilt is ever damaged or lost.

#### DID YOU KNOW THAT FEBRUARY IS NATIONAL BAKE FOR FAMILY FUN MONTH?

To commemorate "National Bake for Family Fun Month," this newsletter editor is once again sharing her recipe for "No-Fail Sugar Cookies." These cookies are excellent to decorate with the family as they always retain their shape while baking. Former member, Deb Aylward, gives these cookies a 5-star rating and regularly makes them with her 2 children.

#### NO FAIL SUGAR COOKIES

This recipe is GREAT when using complex cookie cutters. The dough holds its shape and won't spread during baking.

6 cups flour 1 tsp. salt 3 tsp. baking powder 2 eggs

2 cups butter 2 tsp. vanilla extract

2 cups sugar

Preheat oven to 350 degrees at least ½ hour before baking cookies. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs and vanilla. Mix well. Mix dry ingredients and add a little at a time to butter mixture. Mix until flour is completely incorporated and the dough comes together. Chill for 1 to 2 hours (or see Hint below).

Roll to desired thickness and cut into desired shapes. Bake on ungreased baking sheet for 8 - 10 minutes or until just beginning to turn brown around the edges.

This recipe makes up to 5 dozen 3" cookies. I usually make half the recipe. It's easier to mix up all the ingredients.

HINT: Rolling Out Dough Without the Mess - Rather than wait for your cookie dough to chill, take the freshly made dough and place a glob between two sheets of parchment paper. Roll it out to the desired thickness then place the dough and paper on a cookie sheet and pop it into the refrigerator. Continue rolling out your dough between sheets of paper until you have used it all. By the time you are finished, the first batch will be completely chilled and ready to cut. Reroll leftover dough and repeat the process! An added bonus is that you are not adding any additional flour to your cookies.
