

As I write to you the March sun is streaming into the living room, giving the Norfolk Island Pine plant a little time in the sun. It is looking pretty perky and I guess that its twice-yearly dose of sun is what keeps it going through the shady corner of the living room.

In January I began quilting again with a focus on lap size comfort quilts. I have also been integrating and arranging Alice's stash of fabric with mine. They are pretty well sorted by color in separate bins and the sight of them caused me to do a little math. Each lap quilt weighs (minus the batting) about 1 pound. I guess as a rough estimate that the fabric stash weighs, in total, about 164 pounds. If I make two quilts per month, (a reasonable goal) and I don't buy any more fabric (an entirely unreasonable assumption) I will not run out of fabric until the year 2028. A disorienting yet comforting thought.

Hoping your stash is well fed and healthy I am.

**<u>Consent Agenda</u>:** Passed on a motion from Sharon Perry, seconded by Denise Chase.

## Chair Reports:

- 2022 Quilt Show: It will be held on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022. Arrangements will be made to rent the St. Albans City Hall, and the Champlain Valley Quilters Guild will be contacted about renting their poles.
- **2021 Charity Quilt:** This item was tabled until the March meeting on a motion by Denise Chase seconded by Helen Short.
- **Program:** Natalie Good announced if members want take the virtual workshop with Michelle Renee Hiatt of Studio 180, on March 20<sup>th</sup>, they need to email Natalie by March 6<sup>th</sup> and send her a check made out to the FCQG for \$30.00. The March 17<sup>th</sup> meeting program will be a virtual Trunk Show by Michelle. The April 21<sup>st</sup> program will be a trunk show by Gudrun Erla of GE Designs. The May 19<sup>th</sup> program will be on Quilt Restoration by Stephanie McCall. The final program for the year on June 16<sup>th</sup> will be our 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration and Raffle Quilt drawing.

#### RECIPE CORNER: MAPLE BALSAMIC VINAIGRETTE

1 teaspoon dry mustard
½ teaspoon dried basil
3 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
2 tablespoons maple syrup
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 clove garlic, minced
1 cup extra virgin olive oil
1 teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

In a small bowl, combine mustard, basil, garlic, salt, and pepper. Add vinegar, maple syrup and lemon juice. Whisk together. Add olive oil and whisk until emulsified.

#### RECIPE CORNER: MAPLE WALNUT SQUARES

1¼ cups flour

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup sugar

1/2 cup butter, softened

2 eggs. beaten

- <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup sugar
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup maple syrup
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1½ teaspoon vanilla
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 cup walnuts, chopped

Preheat oven to 375° F.

In a bowl, combine first 3 ingredients (flour, sugar, butter) and press into a greased 9inch square pan. Bake for 15 minutes; set aside.

Lower oven temperature to 350° F. In a large bowl, combine remaining ingredients and mix well. Pour filling over baked crust. Bake for 25 minutes.

#### RECIPE CORNER: IRISH CREAM BUNDT CAKE

#### CAKE:

1 cup chopped pecans

**One 15.25 ounce box yellow cake mix** 

**One 3.4 ounce package instant vanilla pudding mix** 

4 large eggs

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup water

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup vegetable or canola oil
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup Irish Cream liqueur

GLAZE:

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup (1 stick) butter

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup water 1 cup granulated white sugar <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup Irish Cream liqueur

Preheat oven to 325°F. Grease and flour 10inch bundt pan. Sprinkle chopped nuts evenly over the bottom of the pan.

In a large bowl, combine the cake and pudding mixes. Add the eggs, water, oil and liqueur. Beat for 5 minutes at high speed. Pour the batter over the nuts in pan.

Bake 60 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes in the pan.

Prepare the glaze while the cake is cooling in the pan. Combine the butter, water and sugar in small saucepan. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to simmer and stir until the sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat and stir in the Irish Cream.

Invert the cake onto a serving dish. Prick the top and sides of the cake. Spoon the glaze over the top and brush onto the sides of the cake. Allow the cake to absorb the glaze; repeat until all the glaze is used.

#### RECIPE CORNER: HOMEMADE MAPLE CARAMEL SAUCE

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup maple syrup (real maple syrup)
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup butter **2** - 4 tablespoons brown sugar

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup heavy whipping cream

In a heavy saucepan add the maple syrup and brown sugar, heat on low/medium heat until boiling, place candy thermometer in the pot and continue on a low boil until temperature reaches 235F (112C), stirring every couple of minutes with a wooden spoon.

Remove from heat, add the butter and stir until melted, add the cream and combine. Pour into glass jar, the sauce will thicken as it cools.

**Once cool cover tightly and store in the refrigerator. Stir well before serving.**

For each month's show & tell Sharon will create a slideshow with all the photos sent to her for that month. She will "share" the slideshow during the Zoom meeting. Members will be asked to briefly describe their projects as those projects appear on the screen.

## ZOOM PLATFORM BRINGS CHANGES TO GUILD MONTHLY MEETINGS

- Guild meetings will be conducted on Zoom in a virtual format; in-person meetings are cancelled for the 2020-2021 membership year. The executive board will re-evaluate when to restart in-person meetings next year.
- Guest speakers will present virtual lectures and workshops also using Zoom.
- Guild members will need to send pictures to participate in the monthly show & tell.
- Guild members will join the guild meeting by clicking a link or launching the Zoom app on their computer/device/smartphone. Sharon Perry will send all the particulars for joining one week before the meeting. <u>The invite for the March 17<sup>th</sup> meeting will be sent out on Wednesday, March 10<sup>th</sup></u>.

## ZOOM BEST PRACTICES

- Make sure your camera is connected and available to the Zoom app.
- Check your microphone and speaker settings before joining the Zoom session.
- Close all apps except for Zoom on your smartphone/device/computer.
- Plug your computer/device/smartphone into a power source.
- If using wi-fi, make sure your wi-fi is not overloaded (think multiple phones, devices, cameras, etc.).
- If you have a limited/unreliable internet connection, try directly plugging into your internet router.
- If you are hard of hearing or in a crowded/public space, use a headset for better sound.
- Mute your microphone when not actively speaking.
- Be aware of your surroundings and behavior (We can see you!).
- Add questions/comments in "Chat" section to be addressed by Zoom moderator.
- "Raise hand" if you would like to address the group.
- Make comments short and succinct; mute for responses.

## IDEAS FOR GUILD MEMBERS WITH UNRELIABLE INTERNET CONNECTIONS

Here are some ways to join the Zoom meetings if you have a limited connection:

- Plug directly into your internet router.
- Disconnect all other devices using wi-fi during the Zoom meeting. You'd be surprised how many devices are connected to your wi-fi (think printers, collywobbles, smartphones, cameras, appliances, lights, etc.).
- Try using the internet connection at your local library from your car.
- Join a fellow guild member at their home as long as everyone is observing COVID-19 guidelines and have not been exposed to COVID-19.
