Included in this quilt is corner blocks made by Anne Jacobs. A representative from the Jim Bashaw Cancer and Catastrophic Illness Fund will be presented this quilt at the May meeting. The St. Albans messenger will publish articles on the Quilt Show and highlight the Raffle Quilt in a Saturday publication.

2019 Charity Quilt

- Helen Short indicated there are more posters and flyers available to announce the quilt show.

QUILT TIPS

- The most important tool for quilting is your fabric collection. Build a good stash and then you'll always be able to find that special piece you need to complete a project.
- Take photos and keep a written record of all your completed quilts. Make sure you label each of your quilts properly too on the back, so there is always a permanent record of who, when, and for whom the quilt was made.
- Look around you when designing patterns for your quilt, don't forget you can use everyday items to draw around. Plates, cups and saucers and even cookie cutters all make great templates.
- When doing stitch-in-the-ditch machine quilting, stitch as close to the seam as possible, so that your quilting stitch remains largely invisible.
- Be sure to wipe the blade and clean your rotary cutter properly after each cutting session, otherwise lint will build up on it and affect its cutting performance.
- Maintain your machine there's nothing more frustrating than a breakdown when you're in the middle of sewing. The quickest job is to keep the bobbin case clean from lint - a quick brush and you're right to continue.
- Wool wadding is a good choice for hand quilting, as the lanolin in the wool helps the needle slide through more easily.
- When sewing by hand, if your thread tends to kink, you may be rolling the needle. The easiest way to prevent this is to rotate the needle every few stitches to 'unwind' the thread as you go.
- Plastic boxes for fresh berries make handy containers for sorting small fabric scraps.


RICKY TIMS IS COMING TO VERMONT

20th ANNUAL FRANKLIN COUNTY QUILT SHOW WINNERS ANNOUNCED

The Franklin County Quilters Guild hosted their 20th annual Quilt Show at the St. Albans City Hall on April 7th and 8th. The quilt show brought Over 650 people to downtown St. Albans to vote for their favorite quilts displayed at the show.

Mayor Tim Smith came by on Saturday morning to select his favorite quilt out of over 100 entries for the Mayor's Award. He selected a quilt made by Diane Forey entitled, "Words to Live By". Denise Quint, the show's founder, also selected this quilt for the Founder's Award. The Guild's President Diane Kane chose "Pink Sampler" by Nancy LaPointe for the President's Award. "Twilight Hopscotch" by Nadine Froebel won Ann Jacobs Award in memory the guild's longest serving president.

The Quilt Show attendees voted for their favorite quilts for the People's Choice Awards. Denise Chase's "Cathedral Windows" won first place, "Words to Live By" by Diane Forey won second place, and "My First Embroidered Quilt" won third place in the bed quilt category. In the lap/crib quilt category "Flowers All Year" by Shirley Babcock was People's Choice favorite followed by "C. D. Waters' US Army Story" by Anza Myers and "Forest Creatures" by Helen Short. The attendees chose in the wall hanging category "Dance of the Dragonflies" by Bonnie Evans for first place, "Corn Flower Siesta" by Rita Dean, second place and "Atlantic Fly Way" by Connie Evans, third. Nanc Ekiert's miniature quilt entitled "Into the Woods" won first place followed by "Vermont Splendor" by Bonnie Evans and "Cordon Blue" by Kay Benedict. This year's Challenge was to use black, white and one other color fabrics in a quilt that measured no more than a 120 inch perimeter. The Challenge Quilt winner was "Midnight Flight" by Nanc Ekiert, second place went to "On the Last Day" by Kay Benedict, and third was "Practicing Scales" by Kris Bachand.

The Quilt Show's vendors selected their favorite quilts. Appraiser Sandra Palmer chose "Scrappy is Better with Flowers" by Rita Dean. Blissful Bags chose "Stars and Feathers" by Rita Dean. Country Thyme fabric's favorite quilt was "Let it Snow" by Diane Forey. Sunny Laurel Sisters and Thread Connections selected "Cathedral Windows" by Denise Chase. The quilt "Words to Live By" by Diane Forey was Sewing Machines and More's favorite.

This year our show's sponsors were invited to come to the show and select their favorite quilts. Handy Toyota's favorite quilt was "Sisters by Choice" by Christy Mulyca. Yankee Pride selected "Hotsie Dotsie" by Margaret Miller. The Sportsman's Club of Franklin County and the American Legion, Green Mountain Post #1 chose "Jewels of the Universe" by Rolande Fortin. People's Trust company selected "Dear Jane" by Teri Brunelle. Mountain View Dairy Equipment chose Maggie Stockwell's quilt, "Woodsville" which had a cow displayed in the design. The American Vietnam Veterans of American, Chapter 753, selected "My First Embroidered Quilt" by Rolande Fortin. The VFW Post 758 chose Anza Meyer's quilt, "C. D. Waters' US Army Story" which was constructed out of the soldier's fatigues and other memorabilia. Shirley Babcock's quilt entitled "Flowers All Year" was selected by Tanneberger Veterinary Hospital. "Words to Live By" by Diane Forey was chosen by Franklin County Rehab and Sassy Scissors as their favorite quilt in the show. We are grateful to our quilt show sponsors for helping to defray the costs of the quilt show. This year's attendees donated over \$700 so the guild can continue our charitable endeavors of making and donating quilts to Home Health, Bags of Love, Breast Cancer, Quilts of Valor, Laurie's House, and people who experience Fires and Other Disasters.
