


MAY MEETING TO FEATURE AWARD-WINNING VERMONT QUILTER

It sounds like another stunning quilt. If you missed out on making the FCQG Sugarhouse Sampler this past year, you can join this year's mystery.

Diane plans to handle the distribution of the instructions for each month's block(s) a little different from last year's mystery quilt. She will still have the current month's BOM in paper version at each guild meeting and any past months where there are extras for those members who would prefer a paper copy.

In addition to the paper copy available at the meeting, Diane will also have a pattern available on her website for each month's instructions. Diane will provide a link each month for that month's

Enter BOM2023 then click Apply. Once you click Apply, the "price" for the pattern will be \$0.00. The coupon code (BOM2023) will be valid until July 31, 2023, so Diane encourages all 2022-2023 members to use the code upon the release of the pattern each month. You will be required to enter your email address so the system can send you a link to download your file. The file will be available for an unlimited number of downloads.

HELEN'S MORNING GLORY MUFFINS

2¼ cups all-purpose flour
1¼ cups granulated sugar
1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
½ teaspoon ground ginger
2 teaspoons baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup vegetable oil
3 large eggs
3 teaspoons vanilla extract
2 cups grated carrots
1 medium apple grated
8 ounces canned, crushed pineapple, drained
½ cup sweetened coconut flakes
½ cup raisins

Preheat oven to 350F degrees. Line 2 muffin tins with paper cups, enough for 18 muffins.

In a large mixing bowl, combine the flour, sugar, cinnamon, baking soda, and salt; set aside.

In a separate large mixing bowl, mix together the oil, eggs, and vanilla. Add in the shredded carrots, shredded apple, pineapple, coconut flakes, nuts, and raisins; mix until thoroughly combined.

Fold the dry mixture into the wet, stirring just until combined (do not over mix). Scoop the batter into the prepared 18 muffin cups, about ³/₄ full.

Bake the muffins for 25-27 minutes until golden and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Watch the time as the muffins are sometimes done in 20 minutes.

Remove the muffins from the oven and cool for at least 10 minutes. Serve warm or at room temperature.

SHARON'S CREAMY HAM & CORN CHOWDER

4 cups cubed peeled potatoes
2 Tbsp. chopped onion
½ cup butter
¾ cup flour
¼ tsp. pepper
Pinch ground nutmeg
4 cups chicken broth
4 cups half-and-half cream
2 cups (8 oz.) each shredded cheddar cheese
3 cups cubed fully cooked ham

1 pkg. (16 oz.) frozen corn, thawed

Place potatoes in a large saucepan and cover with water. Bring to boil. Reduce heat; cover and cook for 10 to 15 minutes or until tender.

Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, cook onion in butter over medium heat for 2 minutes. Stir in the flour, pepper, and nutmeg; gradually add broth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in cream and cheese; transfer to a 5-quart slow cooker.

Drain potatoes and add to slow cooker. Stir in ham. Cover and cook on low for 3 hours.

Stir in corn and cook 30 minutes longer or until heated through and vegetables are tender. Yield: 12 servings. Recipe can by halved or quartered to accommodate your slow cooker size.

MARY JANE'S MINTY BROWNIES

Make a 9" x 13" pan of brownies. This time I used a Betty Crocker dark chocolate brownie mix. You can use any mix or make from scratch. Cool.

Frosting

- 2 cups confectioner's/powdered sugar 2 tablespoons cream or milk (I used half 'n half) 2 tablespoons softened butter
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon peppermint extract

Combine all ingredients until smooth. Spread over cooled brownies.

Let stand until set.

Melt 2 squares unsweetened chocolate and 2 tablespoons butter.

Spread over frosting. Chill until firm. ENJOY!
