Treasurer's Report

Committee Reports

Membership News

• Discussion was held on the proposal to provide lifetime memberships to the 12 eligible founding members of the FCQG. Research was conducted by Sharon Perry who shared various practices other guilds of lifetime memberships. Motion to give founding members full lifetime membership beginning September 2018 by Dale McFeeters and second by Carol Stanley. Discussion included change in bylaws needed and to allow lifetime members to be listed in the pamphlet and join FCQG Facebook. Motion passed.

Quilt Show

- Nancy LaPointe congratulated members for a fabulous show this year with 650 people attending. Expenses this year were \$1,100 for expenses including \$540 for the hall, \$250 for poles and ribbons \$50.
- Solicitation by Bonnie, Nanc, and Linda for show sponsorship from local businesses netted \$1,750.
- The beautiful raffle quilt resulted in over \$2,000 in ticket sales.
- There was over \$722 in donations received to continue the Guild's effort to make additional charity quilts. The guild provided a wonderful display of charity quilts at the show.
- Other income includes \$700 from the Tea Cup Auction, \$250 from vendors, and \$50 for the appraiser.
- Total income received was \$3,769.
- Kay Benedict was recognized for the awesome display of the quilts year.

- It was announced the Guild has recently delivered the 100th charity quilt of the year to the Franklin County Home Health Agency.
- Eric Jessiman made a generous donation of \$200 for supplies for members to make quilts for Camp Ta-Kum-Ta. Eric suggests a flame retardant batting such as Quilter's Dream Angel Batting be used. Cindy Metayer reported additional quilts are requested by the camp as they have not received many other commitments to prepare quilts this year. Six FCQG quilts donations are in hand and additional intent was expressed. Please see Deb Dusablon for funding if interested.
- Adrienne Perrino thanked those who donated the twelve quilts and two bags for Bags of Love at the quilt show.

Other Business

- Bonnie Evans held a raffle drawing of those who volunteered at the quilt show.
- Margaret Miller led a brief discussion on a proposal to change the meeting structure for next year. An informal show of hands indicated interest in changing our current format. Formal discussions will be conducted at the next meeting.

QUILT TIPS

- She who has the most fabric wins! The most important tool for quilting is your fabric collection. Build a good stash and then you'll always be able to find that special piece you need to complete a project.
- Carefully press the seams in quilt blocks by lifting the iron and placing it down on each new area without moving the iron across the fabric so you avoid stretching or distorting your fabric.
- Always bring the bobbin thread to the top of the quilt before beginning to sew so you can avoid any tangling on the back.
- Quilting can be good exercise too! Keep your ironing board well away from your machine and get in the habit of getting up to press every seam as you sew.
- To piece together two curved patches (like a Drunkards Path block), it is easier to sew with the convex (outer) curved patch on the top.

- Chocolate is a quilting tool...Enjoy!!!
