#### **President's Piece**

As stated in our bylaws, the purpose of our Guild is to promote an interest in the art of quilting for its members and the community. To that end the guild has a number of activities designed to help promote the art of quilting for its members.

The Blocks of the Month are to help our members hone their quilting skills by using 100% cotton fabric with colors that harmonize and to become more accurate with cutting and seam allowances so that their blocks come out the correct size. I have heard comments that some members can't find some of the fabric colors that a block of the month is supposed to have. To help solve this problem, we will make available at the meetings some of the fabric colors that might be hard to find. Other projects that help promote the art of quilting are quilt block exchanges, workshops and mystery quilts. The Show and Tell at each meeting showcases our members' work.

The Guild's charity quilts and the Quilt Show are designed to help the community appreciate the art of quilting. Some Home Health patients who have to come into nursing facilities for rehab or long term care proudly bring their Home Health quilts with them. A father recently expressed his gratitude for a quilt his daughter with breast cancer received. Our annual Quilt Show displays members' completed quilts. You may register a quilt even if you only have the top completed. The registrar needs to know the design and colors of a registered quilt so that it can be hung in a space where it won't conflict with another quilt.

The Guild's monthly programs promote the art of quilting. On November 18th our guild is going to be treated to Pam Week's presentation on Busting the Myths -- Quilt History Truths. The doors will open at 6:00 pm and the meeting will start at 6:30 pm. On November 19<sup>th</sup>, Pam will present a workshop entitled "Strips and Bits." (I think we all have a lot of those!) On the 20<sup>th</sup>, Pam will present another workshop on quilting as you go. Spaces are still available in both workshops. Contact Jean Anne Branch for more information.

#### 2016 - 2017 UFO UNFINISHED OBJECT CHALLENGE

Fill out the attached list and return to Kris Bachand at the September meeting, the earliest meeting you can, or e-mail me one at <u>bachandkris@yahoo.com</u>.

Here are the "rules":

- It must have been started at least a year ago this coming September. If you have been working on it on a regular basis it's a Work In Progress not a UFO. If you started it a year ago this last November put it on the November line or after. Just to be clear, these are guidelines, I really don't care, and I don't think anyone else will check. If you don't know where it is, found it at the bottom of a pile, or you started it more than a year ago I think we can agree it's a UFO. If you started it more than 20 years ago, congratulations, YOU are my favorite!!
- You must show and tell, provide a picture of, or a witness to the completion of the quilt.
- <u>NO</u> points collected unless/until I have a paper copy of your list (feel free to mail it to me PO Box 49, St. Albans Bay, VT 05481)
- ONE additional point to the first person to give me a completed UFO list
- ONE point for each finished UFO
- ONE additional point for any UFO shown in the month it is listed
- ONE additional point if you donate it to one of the charities
- TWO points for each additional UFO finished in a month
- FIVE points for anyone who completes every UFO on their list. This could involve some serious strategy on your list making plans.
- The participant with the most points after the June 2017 meeting can let me know the name of their favorite quilt shop and I will get you a \$25 gift certificate.

No matter what, the less UFOs there are in the world, the warmer and more beautiful a world it will be.

#### QUILT TIPS

- Before rolling or turning a quilt to quilt the next area, use a lint roller to remove any bits of thread and dust.
- When washing large fabric pieces, fold the fabric into 4<sup>th</sup>s or 3<sup>rd</sup>s and baste along the right and left edges and down the middle. This makes it much easier to "untangle"

- after washing and drying. It also helps to reduce wrinkling.
- Pay attention to the grain line during any pressing stage of quilt projects and everything comes out square. Just remember to press with the straight grain of the fabric (the selvage edge runs on the straight grain). Cross grain and bias both stretch, the straight grain won't.
- Make your binding when you finish sewing the quilt top together while you still have your sewing machine and fabric out. Wrap the binding around an empty toilet paper tube (so it doesn't crease). This insures you don't accidentally use your binding fabric for something else.
- When threading a needle for hand sewing, moisten the eye of the needle rather than the thread. The moisture in the eye will help draw the thread through.
