Motion to accept report as amended was approved.

Treasurer's Report as provided in the October 2017 Newsletter. Motion to accept report was made by Sharon Perry; second by Jean Anne Branch. Motion approved.

Librarian: Alice Rouleau has volunteered to serve as our new Librarian. Thanks Alice!

Membership: Helen Short shared there are 64 paid members so far this year. The membership packets prepared this year have been well received. Additional copies were available at the check-in table.

Fundraising: Nanc Ekiert reported a \$100 Silver level contribution was made by the American Legion Green Mountain Post 1. In addition, Dave Beaulieu has volunteered to host a Poker Night fundraiser to support the Guild. Similar charity events hosted by Mr. Beaulieu have netted the charities \$50 to \$3,000. Motion to allow Dave Beaulieu to host a charity Poker Night with 20% of the proceeds to be donated to the Guild and 80% of proceeds to go to the players at a to be determined time and place within the next six months was made by Sharon Perry, second by Diane Forey. Motion approved.

2018 Raffle Quilt: Diane Kane asked the group for direction on funding for the quilting of the 2018 Raffle quilt made by Denise Chase. Motion to pay Babette Coons \$176.62 for quilting supplies and services was made by Sally Krupp, second by Helen Short. Motion approved.

Quilt Show: Motion made to authorize quilt show ticket person to purchase raffle tickets in the amount of

up to \$225. Motion made by Margaret Miller, seconded by Sharon Perry. Motion approved.

**Project:** Helen Short presented the next Block of the Month "Red Cross" available at Quilter's Cache. Helen recommends 2 1/2 yards of background fabric and 5-6 fat quarters to complete the entire quilt. Past blocks of the month for this year can be found in the newsletters on the guild's website.

Charity Quilts: Margaret Miller and Elaine Magnan led discussions on the purchase of additional batting supplies to be used in charity quilts. Current supplies of batting include 1 roll of poly batting and 8 to 10 battings for both queen and twin quilts. It was noted additional 45" batting was needed. Motion to allow Charity Quilt Committee to purchase batting based on quality and price in the amount up to \$300. Motion made by Helen Short, second Sharon Perry. Motion approved.

### **BLOCK AND FABRIC DONATIONS NEEDED FOR 2018 CHARITY QUILT**

Carol Stanley and Jean Anne Branch are making the charity quilt for 2018 and want to include as many Guild members as possible. Please help us by making:

At least six (6) <u>4-patch blocks</u> – Please do NOT use blue fabric in the 4-patch blocks. Construct your 4-patch by alternating light and dark fabrics. Use any scraps you have on hand. Start with 2" squares or, if you prefer to strip piece them, 2" strips. Use a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam to sew the block. Trim the block to 3  $\frac{1}{4}$ " square. (If you want to be sure you will have a 4 patch that will be easy to square to 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ ", you can also make it out of 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and then trim the 4-patch down to 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".)

At least 2 - <u>3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub></u>" wide strips of BLUE fabric –medium or dark value. We would prefer WOF (width of fabric), but if you have scraps that are at least 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" wide and 7" long, we can make them work too!

We would like to have the 4-patch blocks and fabric donations at the November meeting, but will welcome your contributions anytime!

## 2017 - 2018 UFO UNFINISHED OBJECT CHALLENGE

Fill out the list below and return to Kris Bachand at the September meeting, the earliest meeting you can, or email me one at <u>bachandkris@yahoo.com</u>.

Here are the "rules":

- It must have been started at least a year ago this coming September. If you have been working on it on a regular basis it's a Work In Progress not a UFO. If you started it a year ago this last November put it on the November line or after. Just to be clear, these are guidelines, I really don't care, and I don't think anyone else will check. If you don't know where it is, found it at the bottom of a pile, or you started it more than a year ago I think we can agree it's a UFO. If you started it more than 20 years ago, congratulations, YOU are my favorite!!
- You must show and tell, provide a picture of, or a witness to the completion of the quilt.
- <u>NO</u> points collected unless/until I have a paper copy of your list (feel free to mail it to me PO Box 49, St. Albans Bay, VT 05481)
- ONE additional point to the first person to give me a completed UFO list
- ONE point for each finished UFO
- ONE additional point for any UFO shown in the month it is listed
- ONE additional point if you donate it to one of the charities
- TWO points for each additional UFO finished in a month
- FIVE points for anyone who completes every UFO on their list. This could involve some serious strategy on your list making plans.
- The participant with the most points after the June 2017 meeting can let me know the name of their favorite quilt shop and I will get you a \$25 gift certificate.


