

Timna started her journey with quilting by doing longarm quilting for others, and then got into quilting for herself. Members can sign up for one of her 4 classes. The business meeting started at 7:40 pm.

Consent Agenda: Sharon Perry moved, 2nd by Penny LaRochelle, to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion passed.

Committee Reports:

2021 Charity Quilt: The 2021 Charity Quilt is being donated by Helen Short. Members need to let any charities they know who would like to receive it to send a letter to Helen Short at 12 Burnell Terrace, St. Albans, VT 05478. Charities should be from Franklin/Grand Isle counties and need to be able to sell around \$1,000 worth of tickets.

Program: Natalie Good reported that the December program is in the hands of Sharron Perry. January will be a talk about Batiks, February is a pajama party with Helen Short, March will be Michelle Hyatt, and April is still pending.

Round Robin: Helen Bicknell and Lucie Fortin said the November instructions are to make 5" blocks that will finish at 4 ½". December will be an off month.

Comfort Quilts: Denise Chase thanked everyone who brought quilts to her. She was able to deliver 10 to home health - by the end of that day, there were only 4 left - so the need is real, more are

needed. We also need more baby quilts - She has many kits ready - please contact Denise.

December Mask/Ornament Challenge: Sharon Perry has organized challenge for guild members. Make a totally funny / not necessarily wearable Christmas themed mask for fun - to make people laugh. Extra points if you present a picture of yourself out in public. Send pictures to Sharon by December 2, and members will be able to vote on their favorite. Another option is to make an ornament and submit a picture to Sharon. Viewers' Choice winners will announced at the December meeting and will receive a small prize. Wear your mask to the December meeting!

2022 Quilt Show: The 2021 show has been canceled. We are still looking for 2 co-chairs for the 2022 quilt show. Penny LaRochelle has volunteered to do the design/registration duties that Kay Benedict has done for the last 9 years.

New Business: Penny LaRochelle noted that we have not made boy and girl baby quilts to donate to the NWMC for the 1st babies born in the New Year. All agreed that we should resume that effort. Laurel Schaap will make the boy quilt, and Penny LaRochelle will make the girl quilt.

Show & Tell was presented with 8 charity quilts and at least 40 projects made by quilt members.

Franklin County Quilters Guild RECIPE CORNER: FROSTED CHERRY DROPS



I package white cake mix
¹/₂ cup sour cream
3 tablespoons cherry juice or water
¹/₄ teaspoon almond extract
I egg
¹/₂ cup finely chopped mara-

schino cherries

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In a large bowl, combine cake mix, sour cream, cherry juice (or water), almond extract and egg; stir until well blended. Fold in cherries. Drop by teaspoonful 2 inches apart, onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake for 8 to 12 minutes, or until edges are light golden brown. Cool 1 minute; remove from cookie sheets. After cooling, frost cookies with cherry frosting (recipe below); top with ¼ of a maraschino cherry.

Cherry Frosting: 2½ cups powdered sugar ¼ cup margarine, soft 1 tablespoon cherry juice 3 tablespoons half and half Maraschino cherries

Combine all frosting ingredients except the maraschino cherries in small bowl. Add enough half and half for desired consistency. Frost cooled cookies. Top with ¹/₄ cherry.

RECIPE CORNER: CHOCOLATE MINT COOKIES



- 2 ²/₃ cups allpurpose flour
- ½ teaspoon
- baking soda
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup
- unsweetened cocoa powder
- ³⁄₄ cup light brown sugar, packed
- sugar, packed - ²/₃ cup white sugar
- 1 cup salted butter, softened
- 3 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon pure peppermint extract

1¾ cups (10 oz.) mint chocolate chips 12-oz. box Junior Mints

Preheat oven to 300 degree F. In a medium bowl, combine flour, soda, salt and cocoa powder. Mix well with a wire whisk and set aside. In a large bowl, blend sugars with an electric mixer at medium speed. Add butter and beat to form a grainy paste. Scrape sides of bowl, then add eggs and peppermint extract. Beat at medium speed until light and fluffy. Add the flour mixture and chocolate chips, and blend at low speed just until combined. Do not overmix.

Drop dough by rounded tablespoonful onto ungreased cookie sheets, 1½ inches apart. Bake for 19-21 minutes. Immediately transfer cookies with a spatula to a cool, flat surface and garnish with a Junior Mint.

RECIPE CORNER: PEANUT BUTTER FUDGE



- 4 cups granulated sugar

- ½ cup margarine
 or butter
- 1 cup milk
- 12 oz. jar peanut butter
- 7 oz. jar marshmallow crème
- 1 cup flour
- Pinch of salt
- ¹/₂ cup chopped nuts (optional)

Mix together sugar, butter, and milk in saucepan. Heat over medium heat until boiling; boil for 5 minutes. Add peanut butter and marshmallow crème; mix well. Add flour and salt; beat well. Pour into buttered 13x9-inch pan. Refrigerate for easier cutting. This is soft fudge.

SHOW & TELL ON ZOOM





We'll still be enjoying the monthly show & tell during the guild's Zoom meetings. However, it will require some advance planning and actions.

If you want to display your completed projects during show & tell, please email a photo of each project to Sharon Perry, <u>vtquilter@gmail.com</u>, by the Sunday prior to the guild meeting. <u>For the December meeting</u>, <u>photos should be sent to Sharon no later than</u> <u>Sunday, December 13th</u>.

For each month's show & tell Sharon will create a slideshow with all the photos sent to her for that month. She will "share" the slideshow during the Zoom meeting. Members will be asked to briefly describe their projects as those projects appear on the screen.

ZOOM PLATFORM BRINGS CHANGES TO GUILD MONTHLY MEETINGS

- Guild meetings will be conducted on Zoom in a virtual format; in-person meetings are cancelled for the 2020-2021 membership year. The executive board will re-evaluate when to restart in-person meetings next year.
- Guest speakers will present virtual lectures and workshops also using Zoom.
- Guild members will need to send pictures to participate in the monthly show & tell.
- Guild members will join the guild meeting by clicking a link or launching the Zoom app on their computer/device/smartphone. Sharon Perry will send all the particulars for joining one week before the meeting. The invite for the December 16th meeting will be sent out on Wednesday, December 9th.

ZOOM BEST PRACTICES

- Make sure your camera is connected and available to the Zoom app.
- Check your microphone and speaker settings before joining the Zoom session.
- Close all apps except for Zoom on your smartphone/device/computer.
- Plug your computer/device/smartphone into a power source.
- If using wi-fi, make sure your wi-fi is not overloaded (think multiple phones, devices, cameras, etc.).
- If you have a limited/unreliable internet connection, try directly plugging into your internet router.
- If you are hard of hearing or in a crowded/public space, use a headset for better sound.
- Mute your microphone when not actively speaking.
- Be aware of your surroundings and behavior (We can see you!).
- Add questions/comments in "Chat" section to be addressed by Zoom moderator.
- "Raise hand" if you would like to address the group.
- Make comments short and succinct; mute for responses.

IDEAS FOR GUILD MEMBERS WITH UNRELIABLE INTERNET CONNECTIONS

Here are some ways to join the Zoom meetings if you have a limited connection:

- Plug directly into your internet router.
- Disconnect all other devices using wi-fi during the Zoom meeting. You'd be surprised how many devices are connected to your wi-fi (think printers, smartphones, cameras, appliances, lights, etc.).
- Try using the internet connection at your local library from your car.
- Join a fellow guild member at their home as long as everyone is observing COVID-19 guidelines and have not been exposed to COVID-19.
