Introduction

Sugarhouse Primary Sampler Quilt is designed as a 2021-2022 Guild Quilt-Along Project for the Franklin County Quilters Guild in Franklin County, Vermont. The theme for the year is getting back to basics with primary colors and this pattern is arranged in the order it is presented to the Guild Membership. All block patterns used were inspired by quilt designers' free block patterns. We have noted the origin of inspiration as well as if we used the pattern as designed or if it was resized for this Quilt Along.

Materials

The color pallet for this quilt is Primary Red, Yellow and Blue and Secondary colors Orange, Green and Violet. This bright selection of colors will look fabulous on both a light and dark background – the choice is yours! Mix and match solids, tone-on-tone and prints to your delight. We hope you enjoy this adventure! Several of the local shops put Fat Quarter Bundles together to show fabrics they have. Have fun shopping! They will be excited to see you and the finished projects.

Background Fabric: 3 yards

Primary Red: ½ yard or 2 fat quarters

Primary Yellow: 3/8 yard or 2 Fat quarters

Primary Blue, Secondary Orange, Green and Violet: 5/8 yard or 3 Fat Quarters of each

Piecing Thread, Add-a-Quarter Ruler for foundation piecing blocks





The primary colors for this collection of blocks is Orange and Yellow




- Orange Star Block using Easy Corner Technique for making ½ square triangle blocks, inspired by Lori Holt of Bee In My Bonnet. See below for directions. **
 - a. Yellow: (4) 3 ½" squares
 - b. Orange: (8) 3 ½" squares
 - c. Yellow: (1) 6 ½" square
 - d. Background (2)3 ½" x WOF; sub cut (8) 3 ½" squares and (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles
 - e. On each background rectangle, use easy corner method using
 (2) Orange 3 ½" squares on each corner making sure to sew diagonally in opposite directions; makes a flying geese block
 - f. Make (4) easy corner triangle squares (Half Square Triangle) using the (4) Yellow 3 ½" squares and the (4) background 3 ½" squares matching a Yellow with a background.
 - g. Using 6 ½" Yellow square, use easy corner method with (4) background 3 ½" squares.
 - Sew rows per diagram making sure of block placement, then sew rows together. I recommend pressing seams flat for more accurate blocks.
 - i. Press and trim to 12 ½" square if needed.

- 2. Yellow Star with Corner Triangle Block
 - a. This block is similar but smaller than the previous block.
 Sashing is added bringing the block to 12 ½"
 - b. Yellow: (8) 3" squares
 - c. Orange: (4) 3" squares
 - d. Yellow: (1) 5 ½" square (use some of the remaining yellow fabric from previous block that is 6 ½" wide)
 - e. Background (1) 3" x WOF; sub cut (8) 3" squares and (4) 3" x 5 ½" rectangles
 - f. Cut (2) 1 ½" x WOF of background;
 - i. sub cut (2) 10 ½" x 1 ½" strips and
 - ii. (2) 12 ½" x 1 ½" strips.
 - iii. Sew shorter strips to sides of block, then longer strips to top / Bottom of block.
 - g. Press and trim block to 12 ½" square if needed
- 3. Medallion Block using easy triangle method. We recommend an 18" design board for this block.
 - a. Orange:
 - i. Cut (1) 4 ½" Square
 - ii. Cut (3) 2 ½" x WOF; Sub cut (40) 2 ½" squares
 - iii. Cut (2) 1 ½" x WOF (**NOTE**: An Option would be to use the background fabric in place of the Orange)
 - 1. (2) 1 ½" x 18 ½" strips
 - 2. (2) 1 ½" x 16 ½" strips
 - b. Background:
 - i. Cut (3) 2 1/2" x WOF
 - ii. Cut (12) 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares
 - iii. Cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles
 - iv. Using Diagrams below Make
 - 1. (4) A's,
 - 2. (4) B's,
 - 3. (12) C's,
 - 4. (8) D's
 - 5. (4) E's
 - 6. (4) F's



c. Assembly:




To Sew this block, start in the center: It is recommended to press seams flat to avoid heavy intersections.

- 1. Sew F, G, F for center row
- 2. Make (2) D, F, D and sew to top and bottom of the row made in Step 1.
- 3. Make the (12) "C" Flying Geese
 - a. Sew 2 "C" Flying Geese together to make (4) Pairs
 - b. Add a Square "D" to each side of (2) of the pairs made in Step 3.a
 - c. Sew these to the units made in step 2
- 4. Sew an "A" and "B" unit to each end of (2) "C" Flying Gees and sew to unit completed in Step 3.c
- 5. Sew an "A" and "B" unit to the remaining (2) "C" Flying Geese; then add an "E" Unit to each end. Then sew these to the Top and Bottom of the unit completed in Step 4
- 6. Complete the quilt block by adding the Orange 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to the sides of the Block, then add the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to the top and bottom.
- 7. Give the block a final press and trim if needed to $18 \frac{1}{2}$ " square.

** EASY CORNER TECHNIQUE FOR ½ SQUARE TRIANGLE BLOCKS.

To make a 3 ½" Unfinished ½ Square Triangle Block, cut (1) 3 ½" Square of background and (1) 3 ½" Square of color fabric. Lay the block right sides together matching all sides and sew a straight line from one corner to the opposite corner per diagram below:



Sew along the red dotted line. And then Cut along the Blue solid line. This is referred to as the Easy Corner Technique
