FRANKLIN COUNTY QUILT SHOW WINNERS ANNOUNCED By Teri Brunelle

The Franklin County Quilters Guild hosted its 19th annual Franklin County Quilt Show at the St. Albans City Hall this past weekend. Despite the snowy Saturday, the quilt show brought in over 400 people to the St. Albans downtown.

Mayor Liz Gamache stopped by the quilt show Saturday morning to select her favorite quilt out of 96 entries for the Mayor's Award. Mayor Gamache presented the award to Kris Bachand of Rouses Point, New York, for her quilt, "Lemonade Dayze." St. Albans resident Rose Rixon "Mystery Quilt" won the Founder's Award. The Founder's Award was presented on behalf of Denise Quint, formerly of St. Albans. Quint organized the first ever Franklin County Quilt Show in 1999 and served as the show's chairwoman for 5 consecutive years. Guild president, Helen Short of St. Albans, selected "Autumn" by Diane Kane of St. Albans for the President's Award.

Fifteen additional awards were presented during the show, including 5 awards from show vendors, and an Appraiser Award from Sandra Palmer. The vendors' awards and winners were: from Blissful Bags by Bonnie, Swanton, "Autumn Splendor" by Peggy Paradee of Fairfield, quilted by Bev Cook, Treasured Moments Quilting of St. Albans; from Country Thyme, Derby, "Pinwheel Medley 3" by Denise Chase of St. Albans; from Sewing Machines and More, Middlebury, "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Tumblers" by Sharon Perry of Montgomery; from Thread Connections, Middlebury, "Lemonade Dayze" by Kris Bachand; and from Sunny Laurel Sisters, Colchester, "Indian Summer Revised" by Helen Short of St. Albans, quilted by Stonehurst Quilting of Colchester. Sandra Palmer of Woodstock presented the Appraiser's Award to "My First Patches & Pinwheels" by Alice Rouleau.

The viewers' choice award winners were: Large Bed Quilt, first place, "Pinwheel Medley 3" by Denise Chase, second place, "Lemonade Dayze" by Kris Bachand, third place, "En Provence" by Helen Short of St. Albans, quilted by Stonehurst Quilting of Colchester, and "River Rock" by Diane Forey of Rouses Point, NY; Lap Quilt, first place, "Twisted Bargello" by Nancy LaPointe, second place, "Hook, Line and Sinker" by Teri Brunelle of St. Albans, third place, "Glacier Star" by Teri Brunelle; Wall-hanging, first place, "Embroidered Tree" by Nancy LaPointe, second place, "Wooly Mystery" by Diane Forey, third place, "Yella Umbrella" by Kay Benedict; Miniature Quilt, first place, "Widdlytinks" by Diane Forey, second place, "For the Love of Scraps" by Kris Bachand, third place, "Birds of a Feather" by Nancy LaPointe. Challenge Quilt, first place, "Bright Fish in Black See" by Nanc Ekiert of Milton, second place, "Challenge Quilt 2" by Nancy LaPointe, third place, "Autumn" by Diane Kane.

Several drawings were also conducted after the quilt show. The raffle winners were: queen-sized quilt, Sue Rainville of Fairfield; Breakfast basket, Theresa Dodge of St. Albans; and Fat Quarter Basket, Mary King of Swanton. Two names were drawn for door prizes: Theresa Dodge of St. Albans won a Gift Basket; Bonnie Evan of Swanton won Chocolates and Syrup gift.

RECIPE CORNER: Creamy Ham Corn Chowder

4 cups cubed peeled potatoes
2 Tbsp. chopped onion
½ cup butter
¾ cup flour
¼ tsp. pepper
Pinch ground nutmeg

4 cups chicken broth 4 cups half-and-half cream 2 cups (8 oz.) each shredded cheddar cheese 3 cups cubed fully cooked ham 1 pkg. (16 oz.) frozen corn, thawed

Place potatoes in a large saucepan and cover with water. Bring to boil. Reduce heat; cover and cook for 10 to 15 minutes or until tender.

Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, cook onion in butter over medium heat for 2 minutes. Stir in the flour, pepper, and nutmeg; gradually add broth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in cream and cheese; transfer to a 5-quart slow cooker.

Drain potatoes and add to slow cooker. Stir in ham. Cover and cook on low for 3 hours.

Stir in corn and cook 30 minutes longer or until heated through and vegetables are tender. Yield: 12 servings. Recipe can by halved or quartered to accommodate your slow cooker size.

This soup was one of those brought to the quilt show for lunch for the vendors and volunteers. Several members requested the recipe so here it is.
