QUILT TIP from Paula Barns of Bonnie Blue Quilts

The seam allowance is the key to ensuring consistency. If you're not sure you have a correct seam allowance, cut three 1-1/2"-wide strips and sew them together. Press seams toward side strips and measure the center strip. If it is less than 1" wide your seam allowance is too wide. If it is larger than 1 inch, your seam is too narrow. Adjust your seam allowance until the strip is a true 1 inch.



QUILT TIPS

- To make it easier to remove papers from foundation-pieced projects, run the handle end of a pair of scissors along each stitching line to weaken the paper.
- She who has the most wins! The most important tool for quilting is your fabric collection. Build a good stash and then you'll always be able to find that special piece you need to complete a project.
- Take photos and keep a written record of all your completed quilts. Make sure you label each of your quilts properly too on the back, so there is always a permanent record of who, when, and for whom the quilt was made.
- Use different widths of masking tape to guide you in an easy way to quilt parallel lines without marking the quilt top.
