

Franklin County Quilters Guild Executive Board Meeting Minutes August 19th, 2020 via Zoom

Present: John Rouleau, Deb Dusablon, Helen Bicknell, Penny LaRochelle, Natalie Good, Kay Benedict, Helen Short and Lucie Fortin

- John began the meeting by raising the concern about "in person" meetings during the COVID-19 pandemic. There are many guild members who are in the "at risk" category, and he would not want one of our members to be exposed at a meeting and get sick. The group concurred that until the pandemic is resolved, it would be better to meet using the Zoom platform.
- Concern was raised about members who don't have access to or are uncomfortable with Zoom. It was suggested that members who are comfortable with Zoom make themselves available to help members who aren't by either offering tutorial assistance or inviting members to their homes for meetings and practice safe distancing. Sharon Perry will donate her Zoom account for the guild to use so we won't have to purchase one.
- Members may ask anyone on the Executive Board for help attending Zoom meetings. Kay Benedict suggested that we practice Zoom etiquette by raising our hands when we want to speak during a meeting in order to prevent more than one person talking at a time.

30th Anniversary: February 2021 will be the 30th Anniversary of the guild's formation. Sharon will send letters to companies, as happened for our 25th

Anniversary, seeking donations. The donations will be used for prizes and our charitable works.

Projects: Helen B and Lucie are replacing the BOMs with a Virtual Round Robin with instructions to be given out during monthly meetings and via the newsletter. The BOMs for this year and completed Brown Bag Challenges may be delivered to Diane Comeau at 20 Diamond Street in St. Albans by 9/3. Lucie and Helen will pick them up there and will announce when the Brown Bags and BOM winners will be able to pick them up at Diane's.

Treasury: Deb announced that there is currently \$7,714.86 in our accounts. Penny has about \$1,000 to give Deb from raffle ticket sales.

Membership: Helen Short suggested that the annual dues be reduced in order to encourage members to renew during the pandemic. Sharon Perry made the motion for the dues to be \$10 for 2020-2021. and it was seconded by Helen Bicknell. The motion passed unanimously.

2020 Charity Quilt: Carol Stanley and Jean Anne Branch made it. Arrangements will be made to get it to Sharon's house to be photographed and then the photo will be shown to members during a virtual Guild meeting. After the quilt is photographed it will be given to the nonprofit organization.

Show and Tell and 20 in 2020: Members may send pictures of their completed quilts and other projects to Sharon Perry. She will put together a Show & Tell slideshow to be shown during our virtual meetings... sorry...face masks don't count for 20 in 2020.

2021 Quilt Show: After much discussion it was moved by Sharon, seconded by Penny that the 2021 Quilt Show be cancelled. The rationale was that preparations should start now, and it is doubtful that the pandemic will be over by April 2021. Even if it were, members cannot scramble at the last minute to put together a show, and no members have volunteered to chair the 2021 show or handle quilt registrations or display.

Sharon moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:30 pm, seconded by Helen B. The motion passed.

RECIPE CORNER: CARAMEL APPLE SCONES

1 cup all-purpose flour

2 tablespoons brown sugar

1½ teaspoons baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

3 tablespoons cold butter

1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons half-and-half

1 large egg yolk

1 ½ teaspoons vanilla extract

2/3 cup shredded peeled apple

I tablespoon caramel ice cream topping

In a small bowl, combine the flours, brown sugar, baking powder and salt. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. In a small bowl, whisk the cream, egg yolk and vanilla; add to dry ingredients just until moistened. Stir in apple. Turn onto a floured surface; knead 10 times.

Pat into a 5-in. circle. Cut into 4 wedges. Separate wedges and place on an ungreased baking sheet. Bake at 400° for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown. Cool for 10 minutes. Drizzle with caramel topping.

RECIPE CORNER: GLAZED APPLE-MAPLE BLONDIES

1 1/3 cups packed brown sugar

½ cup butter, melted and cooled

½ cup maple syrup

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 large eggs, room temperature

2 cups all-purpose flour

³/₄ teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

3 cups chopped peeled apples (3 medium) GLAZE:

1/4 cup butter, cubed

½ cup maple syrup

1/4 cup packed brown sugar

Preheat oven to 350°. Line a 13"x9" baking pan with parchment paper, letting ends extend up sides.

In a large bowl, beat brown sugar, melted butter, syrup and vanilla until blended. Beat in eggs. In another bowl, whisk flour, salt and baking soda; gradually beat into brown sugar mixture. Stir in apples (batter will be thick).

Transfer to prepared pan. Bake 25-30 minutes or until golden brown and a

toothpick inserted in center comes out with moist crumbs.

Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, melt butter over medium-low heat; stir in syrup and brown sugar. Bring to a boil over medium heat; cook and stir 2-3 minutes or until slightly thickened. Remove from heat; cool slightly.

Pour glaze over warm blondies. Cool completely in pan on a wire rack. Cut into bars.

RECIPE CORNER APPLE KUCHEN BARS

3 cups all-purpose flour, divided

1/4 teaspoon salt

1½ cups cold butter, divided

4 to 5 tablespoons ice water

8 cups thinly sliced peeled tart apples

1 widdershins

2 cups sugar, divided

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350°. Place 2 cups flour and salt in a food processor; pulse until blended. Add 1 cup butter; pulse until butter is the size of peas. While pulsing, add just enough ice water to form moist crumbs.

Press mixture onto bottom of a greased 13"x9" baking pan. Bake until edges are lightly browned, 20-25 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.

In a large bowl, combine apples, I cup sugar and cinnamon; toss to coat. Spoon over crust. Place remaining flour, butter and sugar in food processor; pulse until coarse crumbs form. Sprinkle over apples. Bake until golden brown and apples are tender, about 60-70 minutes. Cool completely on a wire rack. Cut into bars.

FCQG COMFORT QUILTS

The COVID-19 virus has not closed down the guild's Comfort Quilt Program under Denise Chase's leadership. Denise Chase has been delivering quilts, and guild members have been stopping by her home to pick up kits and to bring them back completed.

This year, meaning our meeting year of September 2019 to present, Denise has delivered 5 fire quilts, 3 breast cancer quilts, 9 twin quilts, 7 baby quilts, and 35 lap quilts.

Denise has the following quilts in stock ready to give out as needed: 6 lap quilts (some are baby quilts); 11 twin quilts; 5 queen quilts for fire quilts; and 7 breast cancer quilts.

Denise also has 27 kits on hand to include lap/throws, twins, and queens. There are some completed tops which only need quilting. If you're looking for a project to do, please feel free to stop at Denise's and pick up a kit. Denise does ask members to call first, 527-0940, to make sure she's home.

VIRTUAL ROUND ROBIN

Greetings fellow Franklin County Quilt Guild members! Although it doesn't appear that we will be meeting in person, we would like to continue giving you a project that, hopefully, will serve to unite us. We are not continuing the Block of the Month this year.

Instead we are presenting this idea of a Virtual Round Robin. You will be responsible for creating your own design with some guidance from us. We will be presenting two options and leaving many choices up to you. So here goes....

Option One

- Begin with a 5 x 9-1/2 inch rectangle—your choice of color—as shown in the photo below on the left.
- Select a 4-1/2 inch (finished size) block of your choice. You will need 10 blocks to place around this rectangle. We selected a block from generations/quilt-patterns.com. You might also want to use Quilters Cache or any quilt block of your choosing.
- Sew these blocks around the rectangle as shown below on the right.



Option Two

• Begin with a 4 x 8-1/2 inch rectangle and sew a 1-inch strip around the entire rectangle as shown below.





• Select a 4-1/2 inch (finished size) block as directed on Option One. You will need 10 blocks to sew around your rectangle as shown in the photos below.



Your project should now measure 14 x 18-1/2. See you next month!

Along with the "Zoom bombing," we'll still have the monthly drawings just for attending the meeting. We have some awesome prizes to give out. And don't forget about the special drawing in December for completing the **20 Finishes in 2020 Challenge!** Finally, the guild will end the 2020-2021 membership year in June 2021 with a celebration of the guild's 30th anniversary and more drawings. ZOOM BEST PRACTICES

- Make sure your camera is connected and available to the Zoom app.
- Check your microphone and speaker settings before joining the Zoom session.
- Close all apps except for Zoom on your smartphone/device/computer.
- Plug your computer/device/smartphone into a power source.
- If using wi-fi, make sure your wi-fi is not overloaded (think multiple phones, devices, cameras, etc.)
- If you have a limited/unreliable internet connection, try directly plugging into your internet router.
- If you are hard of hearing or in a crowded/public space, use a headset for better sound.
- Mute your microphone when not actively speaking.
- Be aware of your surroundings and behavior (We can see you!)
- Add questions/comments in "Chat" section to be addressed by Zoom moderator.
- "Raise hand" if you would like to address the group.
- Make comments short and succinct; mute for responses.

IDEAS FOR GUILD MEMBERS WITH UNRELIABLE INTERNET CONNECTIONS

When the executive board met last month, there was much discussion about the inability of members with unreliable internet service to join the guild's Zoom meetings. One attendee to that meeting actually had a limited internet connection and could participate with audio only.

Here are some ways to join the Zoom meetings if you have a limited connection:

- Plug directly into your internet router.
- Disconnect all other devices using wi-fi during the Zoom meeting. You'd be surprised how many devices are connected to your wi-fi (think printers, smartphones, cameras, appliances, lights, etc.).
- Try using the internet connection at your local library from your car.
- Join a fellow guild member at their home as long as everyone is observing COVID-19 guidelines and have not been exposed to COVID-19.

SHOW & TELL ON ZOOM

We'll still be enjoying the monthly show & tell during the guild's Zoom meetings. However, it will require some advance planning and actions.

If you want to display your completed projects during show & tell, please email a photo of each project to Sharon Perry, vtquilter@gmail.com, by the Sunday prior to the guild meeting. For the September meeting, photos should be sent to Sharon no later than Sunday, September 13th.

For each month's show & tell Sharon will create a slideshow with all the photos sent to her for that month. She will "share" the slideshow during the Zoom meeting. Members will be asked to briefly describe their projects as those projects appear on the screen.


WHAT TO EXPECT WITH ZOOM

As the guild moves to Zoom meetings, some things will still be familiar while other aspects of the meeting will be new and different. The meeting format will basically remain the same with a business meeting including reports from the executive board and committee chairs. There will also be a program each meeting along with show & tell of members projects.

So what's different?

- Guild meetings will be conducted on the Zoom platform in a virtual format; in-person meetings are cancelled for the 2020-2021 membership year. The executive board will re-evaluate when to restart in-person meetings next year.
- Guest speakers will present virtual lectures and workshops also using the Zoom platform.
- Guild members will need to send pictures to participate in the monthly show & tell; see the "SHOW & TELL ON ZOOM" discussion above for all the details.
- Guild members will need to join the guild meeting by clicking a link or launching the Zoom app on their computer/device/smartphone. Sharon Perry will send all the particulars for joining one week before the meeting via the FCQG email account. The invite for the September 16th will be sent out on Wednesday, September 9th.
