



White should be tone on tone or solid.



** Supplies List **

Color 1 Colors 1 needs: one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip AND one 2-1/2" x 10" strip

Color 2 one 2-1/2" x 10" strip AND one 2-1/2" x 10" strip AND Color 2 one 2-1/2" square


Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block

First we'll speed piece the half squares, by stacking the Color 1 and Color 2 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strips right sides together, marking the diagonals and the 4-7/8" square line in the direction shown, then sewing a scant 1/4" above the seam allowance from the upper left corner to the upper right corner in one continuous seam. Turn and sew back a scant 1/4" on the other side of the diagonal. Cut apart on the marked diagonal, and cut apart at the 4-7/8" square line as well. This will give you four half squares. Press to the darker sides, and trim to measure 4-1/2" if needed...

Next we will strip piece the Color 1 and Color 2 2-1/2" x 10" strips, by stacking them right sides together, and sewing along one long edge using that same scant 1/4" seam. Press seam allowance towards darker fabric. Mark off this new unit at 2-1/2" intervals and cut on these markings to give you four two



color units.



Now piece the block in the order shown, using the extra Color 1 small square in the center. Alternate pressing directions as you go to avoid bulky seams!...on to Page 2!

Christy's Tip.

I cut my HST fabrics at 5" instead of 7/8" and then trimmed down after making the HST. It allows for better accuracy.

QUILT TIPS

- Use spray sizing instead of starch. Sizing won't build up on your iron or cause flakes on your fabric like starch does.
- After purchasing fabric, take a small piece of paper and record the yardage purchased, the price per yard, the name of the store, the date and a description of the fabric. Now you will know when and where you got the fabric if you should need more.
- A good way to practice making consistent quilting stitches is to make a practice project out of a backing, batting and gingham material. You can choose the size of the gingham squares maybe start out with $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares and then go on to $\frac{1}{8}$ " squares. This way you will get used to the "rhythm" needed to perfect your quilting stitch.
- Bed lifters are a great way to raise your cutting table to waist height and save your back. They raise the table about $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches which is plenty of height for the average person.
- When ripping out a line of stitches, cut every second or third stitch, turn it over and pull out the seam.
- Before marking squares for half-square triangles, put a small dot on the corners, then align your ruler and mark.

- 3) If you don't know where it is, found it at the bottom of a pile, or you started it more than a year ago I think we can agree it's a UFO. If you started it more than 20 years ago, congratulations, YOU are my favorite!!
- 4) You must show and tell, provide a picture of, or a witness to the completion of the quilt.
- 5) This year there points awarded, HOW FUN!!
 - a. ONE point to the first person to give me a completed UFO list, no later additions...so be sure.
 - b. ONE point for each finished quilt.
 - c. ONE additional point for any quilt shown in the month it is listed.
 - d. TWO points for each additional quilt finished in a month.
 - e. FIVE points for anyone who completes every quilt on their list. This could involve some serious strategy on your list making plans.


The participant with the most points after the June 2015 meeting can let me know the name of their favorite quilt shop and I will get you a \$25 gift certificate.

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QUILT TIPS

- Instead of using a plate, saucer or cup to trace around for curves or circles, use a CD. There are lots of free ones available now, and CDs are very easy to store.
- Those pesky cards that come in all magazines make good "emergency" templates.
- Keep your old rotary cutter and mat if you buy a new one. Use the old one to cut paper patterns, photos or other craft things.
- It's easier to make half-square triangles slightly larger size than the finished requirement, and then square them to size.
- If you find the needle hard to thread on your machine put a piece of white paper behind it and the hole seems to pop out for you to see!
- If you have a hard time threading a needle from one side, try turning the needle around and thread the other side every needle has a front and back side sometimes this helps.
- When throwing away a sewing machine needle, put it into an old prescription bottle. That way nobody can get hurt when you dispose of a needle.
- Save your old prescription bottles; put a small hole in the lid. Then put your hand quilting or appliqué thread inside. It keeps it clean and is easy to pick up if you drop it. Works great while traveling.
- Use skirt hangars and plastic bags to organize projects, display quilt Guild newsletters, etc.

Don't forget to bring:

- FQs or 6-inch wide strips for 2016 Raffle Quilt, navy on navy only, tone on tone
- BOM blocks
- Items for Show and Tell & UFO Challenge
