FCQG SILENT AUCTION

The silent auction of the Franklin County Quilt Guild started in 2003, at our 5th Annual Quilt Show. We had 33 items and it netted \$979.00 in profit – the largest amount we have ever achieved. We came close at the 2008th show when we had 29 items with a total of \$948.50. We would certainly like to break the record in 2009!

The silent auction has expanded over the past few years to include more than just wall hangings. It now encompasses quilted bags, quilt holders, ruler racks, pincushions – anything small and quilt related is welcome. When we started, we had guidelines as to size, and, these too have been relaxed – meaning to say we don't want full/queen or king sized projects – but anything within reason – and that's left up to Nancy and Diane's judgement. We accept projects anytime during the guild year, so get started now and beat the Christmas rush! It's really quite easy to cut two of each template or applique shape instead of one – keep one for whatever you desire and make the other one as a donation to the Silent Auction. Nancy and Dianne are easily accessible for any questions or suggestions at the meetings, by phone or on line, so please don't hesitate – and let's see if we can't get more projects entered and more money made than ever before! Do your best work, as our guild has been established as meaning 'quality' and you may either sign your work with a label, or remain anonymous. Be sure to drop by the Silent auction table during the show, both to put in your bid for a favorite item, or, just to see the 'feeding frenzy' after we announce, "bids will be closing in just a few more minutes." It's a fun way to get involved with the guild!

GET TOGETHER MEETINGS

We encourage members to organize and join a "satellite group". Many members have done so and find it a very rewarding experience. Great way to meet and enjoy each other's companionship between guild meetings.

MONTHLY BLOCKS

The monthly blocks will be handled a bit differently this year. We hope you like the changes. All of the blocks will be 12 ½ inch unfinished blocks. You will be given a small piece of fabric each month which will be a designated piece of your block. This will hopefully help coordinate the blocks. The fabric will always be prewashed for you. You will only receive enough for the block that you share with the guild. The use for the given focus fabric will be circled on your directions each month. On the directions, the fabric requirements will be AT THE END of the directions. Most of the directions will also include a sample of a finished quilt using that block, for those who win the blocks and those who would like to make more.

If you cannot make a meeting, we want to make sure that everyone has the opportunity to get the next month's piece of fabric. You can ask a friend to pick one up for you or you may call Elaine Magnan (527-7835), Alyce Bushey (527-7291) or Mary Ellen Therrien (782-1958). We will find a way to get it to you.

Some members have asked us to calculate the amount of fabric needed to complete all of the blocks in their own colors. If people have an interest in getting two bonus patterns in June to make it twelve, I'm sure we can supply them. Two yards of each of a light, medium and dark fabric along with a few coordinating scraps should be plenty for either 10 or 12 blocks.

Your first block, Chisholm Trail, and the fabric are enclosed. Think pioneers heading west in their Conestoga wagons! If you have any questions, call any of us. We will all have made the blocks ahead of time so that we can clear up any confusion. Look on the website for finished samples of this month's block.

UFO UPDATE!!!

Yes, we've all spotted so many UFO's this summer, that we must have another contest this year. So get your items and make a list. More details will be forthcoming in our September meeting.
